## A Word from the Pastor

This week the Church transitions from Christmas season into ordinary time with a month to go until Lent begins. During this liturgical year we will hear from the Gospel of Mark, which is the first and shortest Gospel. There are a number of actions done quickly in Mark's Gospel that reveal Christ's Divine power and these lead ultimately to His Passion on the cross. Throughout the Gospel Jesus keeps his identity as the Messiah secret because the people would not understand what that actually means. St. Mark focuses on the essentials of Christ's work and how the group of followers grows. This can be something for us to focus on as God's people.


What are the essential things I need to do for God in the coming weeks? Who can I invite to "come and see" Jesus in the proclamation of His Word and in the reception of His Body? Who are the sick, afflicted, and hungry that I can reach out to at this time? Let's take an inventory and take care of business.

## Peaceful Transfer of Power/ Constant Witness to Life

During this week I pray for a peaceful transition of power as a new president is inaugurated. The truth is that neither party fulfills Catholic social teaching and we need to be a prophetic voice with whoever is in office. As Catholics, we will need to be a voice for the unborn as well as the refugee and the poor. We need to uphold the free practice of religion as an inherent right given by God and not stripped by the government. We need to uphold the sanctity of marriage between one man and one woman. Nonetheless we need to respect the justly proved decisions of electors and not resort to violence in this transition. The votes are in and Joe Biden will be our 46th president this Wednesday. Let's do our part to keep the peace and abide by a well-formed conscience.

## Pope Francis Encyclical Presentation (2 PM TODAY)

This Sunday there is an opportunity to form our conscience more fully with Catholic social teaching. Paul Fahey will be giving a talk here on the latest encyclical, Fratelli Tutti (All are brothers).
